The training will present an overview of federal, state, and local requirements pertaining to the education of English Language Learners, the scope and purpose of the standards, the format of the standards documents, and the use of the standards by educators in <u>all</u> content areas (general education as well as ESL). Attention will be paid to the links between the ELPS and the GLEs and GSEs. The training will illustrate techniques for developing standards-based lessons and assessments incorporating the ELPS. Teachers and administrators can then apply these techniques in their local settings.

- 1. Become familiar with federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and/or policies pertaining to the education of ELLs
- 2. Build their understanding of the factors affecting second language acquisition
- 3. Understand the role of academic language proficiency in shaping English language proficiency and in the academic outcomes for ELLs
- 4. Become familiar with English language proficiency standards and their application in the development of curriculum and instruction
- 5. Have strategies to use English language proficiency standards as the basis for assessment accommodations and adaptations for English language learners
